

Handprint or Fingerprint Art

This craft is perfect for creating lasting memories while spending quality time together. It's simple, adorable, and makes a wonderful keepsake or gift!



Materials:

- Construction paper, cardstock, or old cardboard (repurposed is great!)
- Non-toxic acrylic paint or washable paint (child-safe)
- Paintbrushes or sponges
- Markers, crayons, or colored pencils
- A damp cloth or wipes (for easy cleanup)
- Optional: Googly eyes, glitter, or stickers for extra fun!

Instructions:

1. Set Up Your Craft Station

Lay out some newspaper or an old cloth to protect your table from any messy spills. Put on some fun music to get the creative vibes flowing!

2. Pick Your Colors!

Choose a few paint colors you want to use. Pour a small amount of paint onto a palette or a paper plate—be careful, you don't need much! Feel free to mix colors for extra fun.

3. Make Your Handprints or Fingerprints

- **Handprints:** Paint your hands or your child's hands using a brush or sponge, making sure the paint covers the entire hand but isn't too thick. Gently press the hand onto your chosen paper and lift it off slowly to reveal the cute print!
- **Fingerprints:** Dip your fingertip into the paint (just a little dab!) and press it gently onto the paper. Repeat this to make patterns or animals.

4. Turn Prints into Fun Creations

Here comes the magic! Using markers, crayons, or paint, transform the handprints and fingerprints into cute animals, trees, flowers, or whatever your heart desires!

- **Handprint Ideas:** Turn a handprint upside down and draw a stem to make a blooming flower. Or turn it into a handprint fish by adding fins and bubbles!
- **Fingerprint Ideas:** Add wings to your fingerprints to create a flock of butterflies. Draw tiny legs and antennas for a line of fingerprint ants marching across the page!

5. Add Some Fun Decorations

Bring your art to life with googly eyes, glitter, or fun stickers. For an extra cute touch, you can outline the prints in bright colors or draw funny little faces on the prints.

6. Sign and Date Your Masterpiece

Don't forget to sign your art and add the date! It's a sweet way to remember when you made this special craft.

7. Show It Off!

Display your new artwork on the fridge, or frame it as a gift for a grandparent, teacher, or family friend. Handprint and fingerprint art is always a hit!
